The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) was passed into law to provide disabled Americans with equal access to both public and private facilities. Until the passage of ADA, disabled Americans struggled to gain access to many buildings around the country and throughout the State. Although most new buildings are ADA and Title 24 compliant, some north state businesses may not be compliant with both State and Federal disability access laws. In some cases, non-compliant businesses may be vulnerable to costly litigation.

ADA and Title 24 disability access expert and City of Redding Building Official, Bill Nagel will present information on the:

- Disability access requirements and how to make your business compliant
- Your liability and your rights
